# **Two tie** for first on bulls

Cowboys don't make a big deal about catching a bad break because it's just part of rodeo, whether it's an unfavorable draw or a fractured bone.

Robert Bowers and Vince Stanton are proof. The two cowboys tied for first place in the bull-riding go-round Tuesday night in the National Finals Rodeo, when only five bulls were ridden for the full eight seconds.

That was a big improvement over the previ-

ous two days when a total of five riders were able to stay on, making it the rankest event of the week.

Bowers, who had broken his left forearm in each of the past three years, thinks he might have made it four in a row during his 84-point ride Tuesday.

"I heard (my forearm) pop real bad when I was riding," Bowers said, an ice pack attached from wrist to elbow.

If it's broken, he has had plenty of practice on what to do.

"I'll just go to my other hand if it's broke," he said. "I'll do that if I have to. I'll get on no

matter what.

"I feel confident with my right hand, but I might not be able to ride the rankest bull."

Stanton's pain was eased when he drew Mail Man, a bull he had ridden two months ago at the Original Coors Rodeo in Phoenix.

"He's just good to ride," Stanton said as he untied his shoulder brace. "He kicks like a bareback or bronc."

Stanton — son of Bill Stanton, a five-time finals bull-riding qualifier — not only had not made a full ride in the finals, a wagonload of injuries had contributed to him riding only five bulls successfully in his last 20 rodeos over the past two months.

"I almost forgot what it's like to ride," said Stanton, of Weiser, Idaho.

Bowers and Stanton each won \$11,555.

While a bit of physical agony dimmed the glee of the bull riders, Pete Hawkins couldn't quit smiling.

Hawkins padded his lead in the world-championship standings by winning the bareback event for the second consecutive night and third in the last four. The win pushed his finals earnings to an NFR-best \$35,726 and his season total to \$125,221.

"If it's all right, y'all, I'll be back every night," said Hawkins, of Weatherford, Texas.

Hawkins rode I'm A Tiger Sko-

al for 88 points.

"I know damn well if every time I nod my head and do my best, that's all I can do.

"That's the way God intended

everyone to live their life: to try their damnedest and hardest every time."

Other winners in the fifth round were Birch Negaard, steer wrestling; Speed Williams and Rich Skelton, team roping; Billy Etbauer, saddle bronc; Mike Matt, bull fighting; and Janet Stover, barrel racing.

The only change in finals average leaders was Williams and Skelton, who regained the lead in team roping from Daniel Green and Allen Bach.

For the all-around world championship, Cody Ohl has won \$39,452 in calf and steer roping to pull to within less than \$10,000 of Fred Whitfield, who came to Las Vegas as the leader. Whitfield, who has won \$21,549 in the finals, leads Ohl \$173,887 to \$164,702.
